RETURN TO OUR CHURCH

As you will be aware the Scottish Government has said that with safeguards and appropriate risk assessments Church of Scotland buildings can open for worship. Some of our local churches have already begun to do so whilst others are still planning. As intimated a couple of weeks ago, our Property Convenor and Health and Safety Administrator (Alex Duncan and Frances Dent) have begun to plan for the opening of Logie & St. John's (Cross) and, following discussions at the Kirk session meeting this week, that day is getting closer. We now need to prepare the church. We want to ensure that our preparations make the building as safe as possible. Amongst a list of things to do the cushions will need to be removed from the pews, surfaces cleaned, sanitizing areas identified, appropriate signage put in place, and designated areas for seating identified but we hope that by the end of this month we will have a date for opening.

We will send you further information soon. Of course our online recorded worship will still be available and we appreciate that, for some, returning to our building may not be possible in the immediate future. Church is much more than the building.
